The school administration team had requested that the Parent Council have a speaker on social and emotional well being of teenage students. This would likely be in December. Erica commented that it would be most effective if the students are covering the similar topic during the school day so the speaker can reinforce the topic with the parents with the speaker. Erica will follow up with administration. Other topics could be substance abuse, mental health, etc. Last year there was a speaker on substance abuse associated with Teen Challenge and there were many resource tables available on other topics. It would be great to repeat it this year as well. Another suggestion is to also have a speaker set up for the beginning of next year prior to MEA to help the students/parents cope with the changing seasons and pressures in school and home.

Committee notes:

Briefly reviewed the volunteer teams. Steph Smith is not on Washburn Cares. Meighan Middleton has agreed to take over the Poinsettia sale with proceeds going to Washburn Cares.

- **Give to the Max Day** (Nov 16, 2017) Erica said calculators and 9th grade novels to increase a diverse library. She will reconfirm with the school. Melanie Faulhaber and Jenn Buss are assisting with communication.
- Washburn Cares Gift card drive is very successful and great for the families. Looking for Walmart, Cub, Walgreens and Target gift cards. An idea was proposed to promote the gift card drive to the students. Jenn Buss will have her son Ethan bring it up at the next student council meeting. Washburn Cares identified more areas they support. They work closely

- with the school social worker. Support areas: Thanksgiving bags of food, senior pictures, reduced price tickets to prom, snacks for school for kids needing transition, gift card drive.
- Poinsettia Sale Terri Nelson is running it this year with Meighan Middleton shadowing. The proceeds (@\$500/year) will be allocated to support Washburn Cares.
- Barnes & Noble Book Fair Dec 2, 2017 Money raised is given to media center in the form of B&N gift cards to purchase needed books. Families can also purchase books that are on teachers' wish lists. NHS will provide wrapping. Music (choir & band) perform. Robotics will be there. Need to continue to advertise for the event.
- Plant Sale a committee meeting will be held on Dec 4, 2017. Tangletown Gardens will give us a coupon to hand out during plant sale where 10% of purchases with the coupon will go back to Washburn.
- Prospective Student Tours There are 5 dates for tours: Friday 12/8/17, Tuesday 12/12/17, Thursday 1/11/18, Tuesday 1/30/18, Friday 2/2/18. The tours are 9:15am-10:45am. SignUp Genius Link for incoming families htttp://www.signupgenius.com/go/30e0c4ea9a62ca3f94-prospective1
 There will be a parent training session on Nov 16th at 2:45pm
 Missy is requesting at Site Council to have a half sheet promotional material for Parent Council in the incoming 9th grade folders. The other half sheet could be for Site Council.
- Egyptian Dinner scheduled for Sat Feb10th.
- Senior Party location has been reserved. Looking to book talent. Erica will send out an email to Senior parents to create a planning committee for the party. They won't need to volunteer the night of the event but their input for planning would be great. Will need to set up a SignUp Genius and link it to the Parent Council volunteer page.

Legal and Accounting:

One checking account now manages the general funds, plant sale and senior party.

Non profit status: It was a unanimous decision to set up a 501(c) 3 for the Parent Council to be a non-profit organization. Diana will look further into using a booster club organization as the shell and look into what other options we have.

Prior year financial activity in general account: General account funding last year was \$2,385 from Battle of the Bands and the Egyptian Dinner. The expenses for the year were \$1,841. There are funds available from the general funds. There are available funds from the plant sale and

senior party that were transferred into the general fund. A cash flow will need to be generated to see when deposits will need to be made for the plant sale and senior party.

Washburn Cares: Erica and Heidi would like to have funds for Washburn Cares. The committee is looking to provide Thanksgiving food bags for some families. They are also looking at subsidizing senior pictures and/or yearbooks, reduced price tickets to prom, funding to the school for snacks for kids who are in transition during the day. The first year request is to have \$1,000 available plus the proceeds from the poinsettia sale.

Landscape costs: Beth Forsline requested \$500 for this year. This is a reasonable request as compared to prior years.

Directory: Online directory will need to be paid in November for the next year. Cost is \$298 annually.

Teacher Appreciation food: Sign Up Genius will be used to coordinate donations for the Teacher Appreciation lunches/dinners for fall & spring. Parent Council may need to fill in for items not provided. It is requested that the Parent Council provide funding for Teacher Breakfasts (start of the school year and end of the school year). Cost is estimated to be \$300 per time or \$600 for the year.

Speakers: It is requested for the budget to include \$1,000 for speakers/presenters. Ideally would have a speaker in the fall and one in the spring.

Senior Party - Senior Party has received \$2,500 per year from the plant sale in past years. Recommendation is to give Senior Party an additional \$1,000 for a total of \$3,500 funding for SY 2017-2018. One of the suggestions was to reduce the ticket price to \$25 from \$30. It is not known if the reduction of \$5 for the senior party would result in a higher turnout or not. Getting the senior parents involved with planning may help to increase the attendance.

Square account for Miller Mart/Spirit Wear: Miller Mart would like a Square account set up to collect funds for spirit wear and turn the funds over to the school. Once the Parent Council is a non-profit, this could be set up with funds to flow through the school. An estimate of the amount of funds expected to be collected would be good to know to determine if the annual gross receipts would stay less than \$50,000 each year. Receipts less than \$50,000 each year allows for a postcard filing. Receipts higher than \$50,000 will result in completing 990EZ.

Recap of expenditures: Washburn Cares \$1,000 + estimated \$500 from Poinsettia sale, Landscaping \$500, Directory \$300, Teacher breakfasts \$600, Speakers/presenters \$1,000, Senior Party \$3,500 from plant sale + general funds, Senior Party addtl costs covered by funds brought in \$7,500= Total net expenditure: \$14,900

Expected receipts: Egyptian Dinner \$1,200, Battle of the Bands \$1,200, Poinsettia Sale \$500, Plant Sale \$2,500, Senior Party \$7,500. = \$12,900 SY 2017-2018 use of prior cash balance = \$2,000
